
Grounds of Remembrance in Dublin Veterans Park



The Memory Wall

Located at the edge of the Grounds overlooking Indian Run stream, the Memory Wall's brass inserts invite visitors to leave personal messages. A limestone bench provides a place for quiet respite and reflection.





The Dedication Wall pays tribute to the Armed Forces with bronze medallions of the five branches of service.

The smooth structure of the wall was designed to contrast with the iconic rugged limestone border of Indian Run Cemetery. The American and POW-MIA flags are proudly displayed at the end of the wall.

The Loggia

The 10-by-60-foot copper-clad Loggia features the words of Ralph Waldo Emerson's "Concord Hymn." A place for ceremony, shelter and collective pause, the Loggia creates a panoramic window to view the Grounds.





Placed near the Loggia, the limestone memorial gives special recognition to prisoners of war and those missing or killed in action.

represents individual journeys. The Stones honor veterans with personal inscriptions and general messages of gratitude.

Patron's Sycamore Grove

The Sycamore Grove provides a natural canopy for the collective gathering space. Sycamores are symbols of longevity, renewal and shelter. The young sycamores create a sacred space and represent new life outside the cemetery. The bark on the trees symbolizes young and old, further uniting past and current generations. Bronze plaques recognize community donors.
